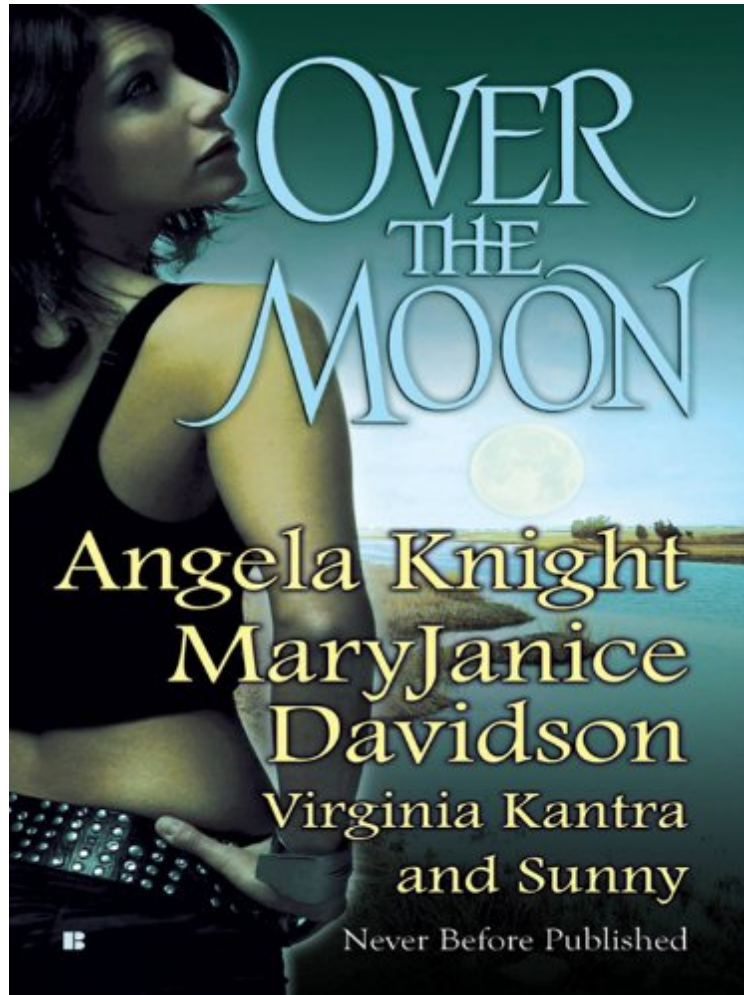

Mixed bag of paranormal romance Von bsmorgentau Angela Knight: Moon Dance - a story set in the Mageverse - aristocratic Werewolf Elena needs to find a protector in a hurry, or find herself in an abusive dynastic mating. I love Angela Knight and this story. Virginia Kantra offers an unfortunate mixture of Celtic fairies and Christian prejudices / hell. Only Caitlin's love can save Rhys from a fate worse than death. In my opinion Celtic mythology with Sidhe seen as soulless and heathenish from a biased Christian viewpoint does not work well. MaryJanice Davidson: A vampire falls for a werewolf. Well I liked Davidson's first vampire and werewolf books, but - is it only me? - the humor seems to be getting thinner and it just isn't particularly funny anymore. Sunny: Mona Lisa Three: advertised as "Fans of Laurell K. Hamilton will love Sunny" - well indeed. The idea of a supernatural heroine keeping a harem of men is just like in LKH. Healing by sex and skin glowing during sex is straight from LKH, too. The social structure - a queen keeping a court of males, ranked according to power as princes, warlords, ordinary; the demon dead and hellhounds - is lifted unaltered from Anne Bishop's Black Jewels Trilogy. Only the level of eroticism is perhaps enhanced, Mona Lisa Three includes a true ménage scene. Well it lacked originality, but since I am a great fan of LKH and Anne Bishop and this story is very similar perhaps I'll also get the other Mona Lisa books.
