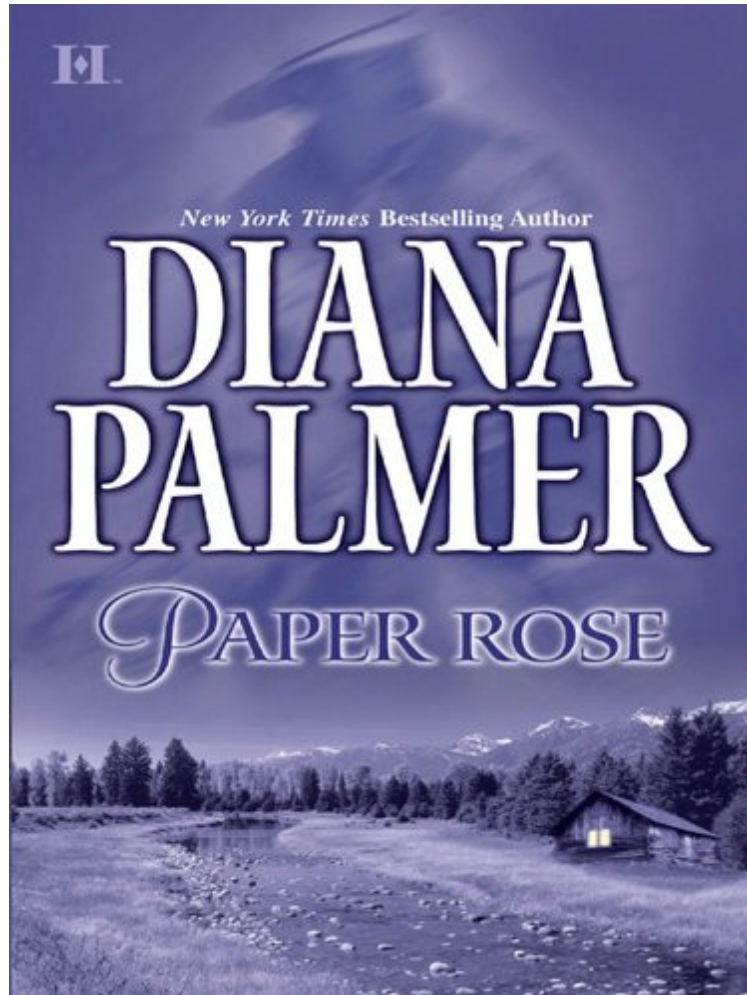

That's my first and major problem with this book. Another issue was that Ms. Palmer spent the first 3 chapters explaining the characters and their circumstances over and over. The next was that our hero, Tate, went through much of the book as an angry man. That gets very old. Further, for characters who place so much value on honesty, they certainly spent enough time lying.This book is standard Palmer fare. The heroine is virginal and scared of sex, the hero is forceful and dark-complexioned. There were some plot holes and odd decisions that further weakened this book, yet, I can't pan it entirely because it was an all right read. The hero even explains his decision to make racist decisions, but it was too little and too late for

me to believe it. There are some old Palmer books where her formula works very well. This isn't one of them.
