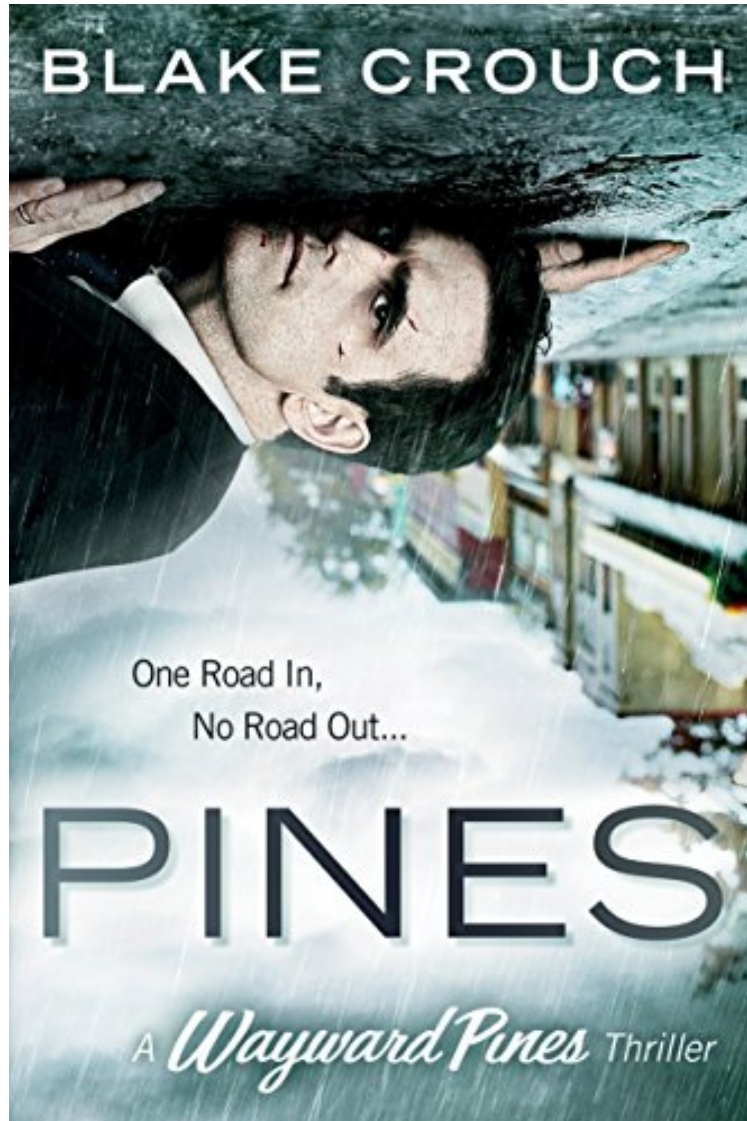

Beim Lesen wurde ich sofort in die Handlung hineingezogen und konnte das Buch nicht weglegen, da ich unbedingt wissen wollte und musste, was es um die mysteriösen Vorgänge in dem Rocky-Mountain-Städtchen Wayward Pines auf sich hat. Als sich die Handlung der Auflösung näherte, fand ich die Geschichte dann doch stellenweise ein wenig an den Haaren herbeigezogen, weshalb ich bei meiner Gesamtbewertung einen Stern abziehe.
