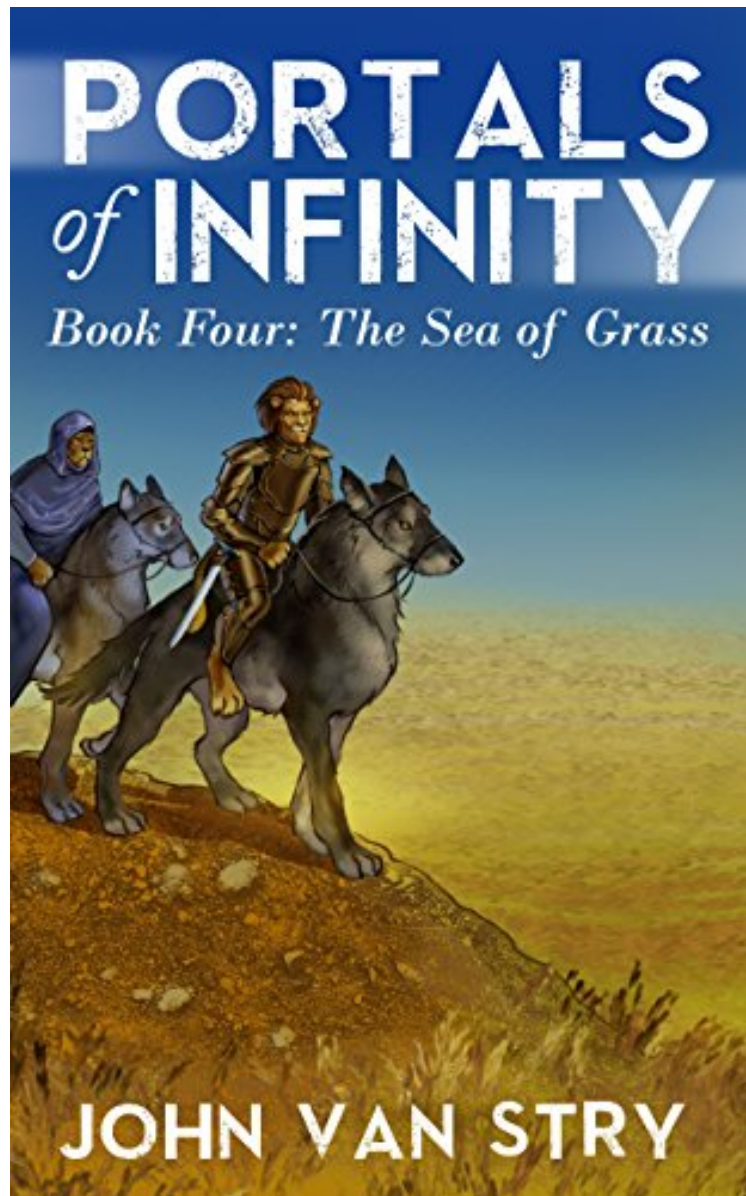

That is not necessarily really a bad thing. There has been more action in the previous books. Instead we now have more world building and the foundation for later conflicts get laid (down). Lots of things that started in earlier books have to actually grow to bear fruit and this book tells about what happens between the last 'big' war that actually were just a few days long and the next war, that might take several years of cold war and preparations before we get to the real action. Ok, i admit, i'm much happier with a story with a good background and all the little details that may look unimportant but are what makes the difference between a story told with your soul in it and one that simply gets rattled of, product finished, next customer.
