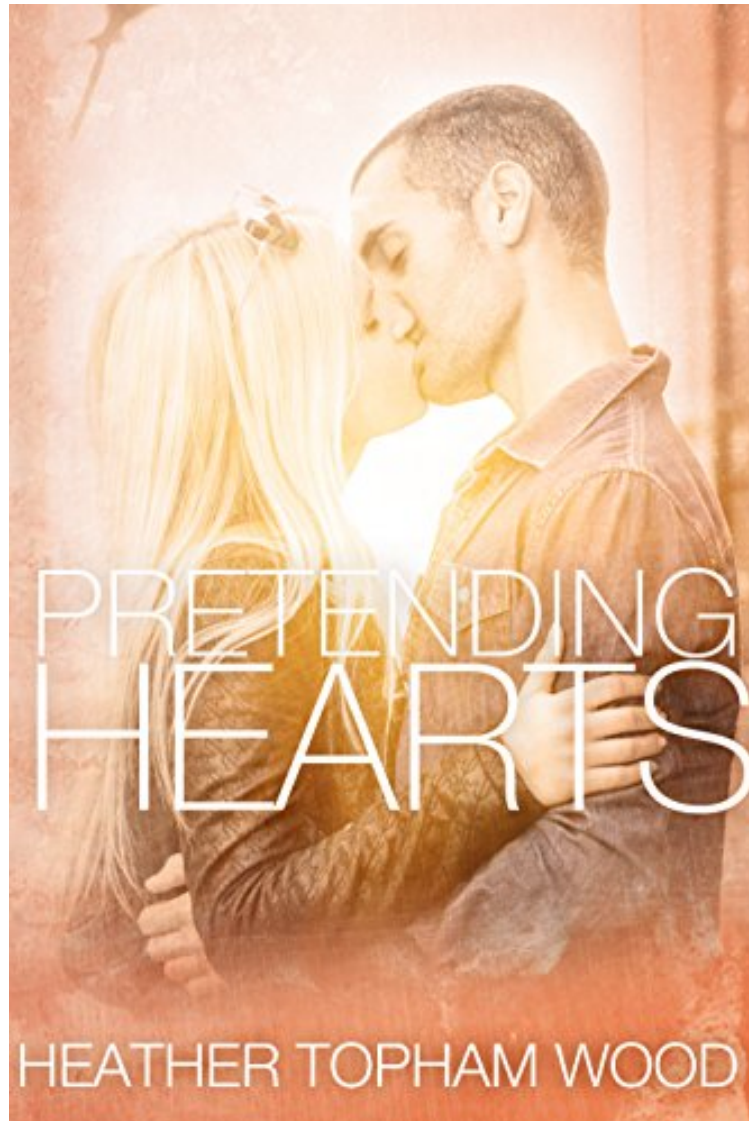

warming Von Little Darling Heather Topham Wood does it again and not only lives up to the high expectations after *Falling For Autumn*, but exceeds them with the sequel *Pretending Hearts*. We've met Delia in *Autumns* and Blake's story and gotten to know her as his little sister. Although she made me angry back then, I was intrigued to learn her story. And what a story it is. Once I started reading, gone was my anger, replaced by sympathy, understanding and heart-ache. Delia isn't the bitch, I'd love to make her out to be. Instead, she's a confused girl, torn between the loyalty to her parents and her true self. The consequences of her parents' actions are far-reaching, threatening to not only define, but ruin Delia's future. And it isn't only her father's ex-convict sexual offender registry status that has pulled quote a number on Delia and how she sees life. Her mother's attitude towards her and her beauty, money and men and the lack of warmth and love she gave her daughter, have caused a similar amount of heart-ache for Delia. It isn't helped by the fact that her brother Blake not only is dating the woman that is the root of all destruction in Delia's eyes, but is now also a famous NFL player, making Delia eager to step out of his shadows and be seen for herself. For the person she is on the inside, college offers her the chance to do just that and she is eager for this experience. It turns out that her first year of college will impart numerous life lessons on her forcing her to confront herself as well as her demons. Not only does she end up learning who she really is and not who others expect her to be, but she also realizes what is truly important in life and that she is strong enough to confront painful truths. The lessons don't come easy to her not with her feelings getting hurt when she realizes she was blinded by the people she wanted to trust. And not when her life seems to fall apart when one painful event chases the other. Through all of it, I admired her strength and her determination. She didn't allow others to break her. No matter how hard it got, she clawed her way out and didn't give up. Instead of drowning in self-pity, she fights, she learns and she grows. By the end of the book I adored the hell out of her for her courage, fierceness and strength. After her disastrous relationship with the privileged waste of space that is Wyatt, her friendship with Levi was heart-warming. And how could it not be. Levi managed to charm me off my feet. A nice guy who is proof that they don't always finish last. He is down-to-earth and laid-back, being his own person never compromising who he is or what he believes in. He doesn't give a crap about expectations and society's rules, living his life the way it feels right to him. Alone for that he had my admiration. Despite experiencing a tragedy, he doesn't allow it to define his life and get in the way of his happiness. He is loyal to the people he loves and he devotes himself to his music and once Delia comes into her life, he also devotes himself to her. Schon relativ früh fiel auf, dass das Buch miserabel lektoriert wurde (Buchstaben fehlen, Satzkonstruktionen machen keinen Sinn, der Schreibstil ist nicht sehr gut) und das allein hätte man noch relativ ignorieren können. Die Protagonistin Delia wirkte vielschichtig, im Vergleich zu den Protagonisten aus den vorherigen 2 Bchern hatte sie auf jeden Fall mehr Substanz und ihre Geschichte mit Wyatt und Levi ist zwar etwas vorhersehbar, aber es liest sich durchaus angenehm. Levi ist ein interessanter Charakter und just in dem Moment in dem man sich darauf freut, dass Delia mit ihm zusammen kommt, findet sie plötzlich heraus, dass sie von Wyatt schwanger ist. Dies wirkt jedoch derartig deplaziert, dass sich der Eindruck aufdrängt, dass man Füllmaterial bekommen wollte, damit sich das Buch noch streckt. Desweiteren wirkt es einfach dermaßen beladen, weil es ohnehin schon gegend Konflikte im Buch gibt (vor allem die Geschichte mit ihrem Vater und Autumn) und dann einfach ein Klischeethema noch oben drauf gepackt wird. Zwar bietet das Buch letztlich einen guten Abschluss in der ganzen Serie (bezogen auf ihren Vater), aber das war es dann leider auch schon. Der Schreibstil ist wirklich miserabel (dass die Autorin Englisch studiert haben soll, geht mir nicht in den Kopf) und ich würde das Buch nur Leuten empfehlen, die absolut gar keinen Wert auf Anspruch legen.
