His handling of the Battles of Medellin and Talavera is masterly, with such vivid descriptions that one is drawn irresistibly into the action. Throughout the author pays in-depth attention to Napoleonic tactics both British and French. His main protagonist's characterisation's are further developed to a degree that you actually find yourself caring for them. The subplots in between the main engagements are full of daring and intrigue with a strong sense of the period. All in all another excellent sequel, keep up the good work Adrian.
