These are the ingredients to create an explosive mix and a wonderful story.The two main characters, Hyunkyung and Indigo, have a really bad start. Hyunkyung is not impressed with Indigo at first. She wants to send her home. Well, Indigo is not pleased either,

doesn't know why she was sent to Korea in the first place and wants to go home, too. In a way, the story can only take place because all flights back to the US were already booked out. Hyunkyung decides to have at least a hopefully not too embarrassing evening with Indigo, and Indigo shows qualities that Hyunkyung would not have expected at all and she realizes that she is enchanted by this American girl. If you want to find out what these qualities are, what makes Indigo so special for the other woman, get the book. I can definitely recommend it. I enjoyed every second of the story, and partly this was because Indigo never knew more than the reader and Hyunkyung is not safe from surprises concerning Indigo either. Sure, we do get to know more about Hyunkyung's way of thinking, but basically I felt as surprised as Indigo about what Hyunkyung was up to, and wondered what would happen next. Virtually everything about her time in Korea is a mystery to Indigo. Seeing the rational Hyunkyung try to figure out Indigo is fun. Hyunkyung tries to keep some distance for quite a while, but she fosters secret hopes that this Indigo might be more than she appeared to be at first sight. It is wonderful to see how the women get to know each other. We can follow both women's thoughts, as the point of view changes in the different chapters and Anastasia Vitsky is able to describe the nuances of what the characters are like, what each of them perceives, in a subtle way and with much love for details. Not surprisingly, I love the professional ease Miss Vitsky shows throughout the book. I openly admit that I adore this style of writing. It is playful and lively on the one hand, but always to the point at the same time. You get a crystal clear impression of emotional states, without excessive words, which leaves enough room for your own imagination to kick in. Apart from these two women who might become lovers, the clash of Korean and American culture is obvious throughout the story (but not exaggerated). Compared to the strict hierarchical thinking and acting of the Koreans, Indigo unwillingly shows almost anarchic qualities that spice up everything. Much of this happens out of ignorance and because of her being so honest and vulnerable. In the course of events she is hurt emotionally and her way of coping is different from the Korean way, too. In addition, there are a few situations that show cultural differences tongue-in-cheek. I loved this, because it was woven into the plot so nicely and easily. For me it added to the characters. As for the characters themselves, I found both of them very lovable and touching. They are not perfect and struggle with the emotional burdens every reader knows about. I did not even find the reasons that led to Indigo being sent to Korea over the top, after all we live in an age where personal assistants and agencies solve any problem for wealthy customers. Had the story caught me? Yes absolutely yes! Anastasia Vitsky has an awesome style of writing. Her characters have depth, their problems are what virtually everybody has experienced in one way or the other. I am talking about emotional issues here. These are connected to unexpected developments and then there is the question about the happy ending. In *Seoul Spankings* it was not clear for me whether there would be a happy ending or not. I had hoped for one, but I was left guessing whether it would happen. This kept me reading with a lot of joy. So, if you enjoy reading an exciting f/f story, this is a book I absolutely recommend.
