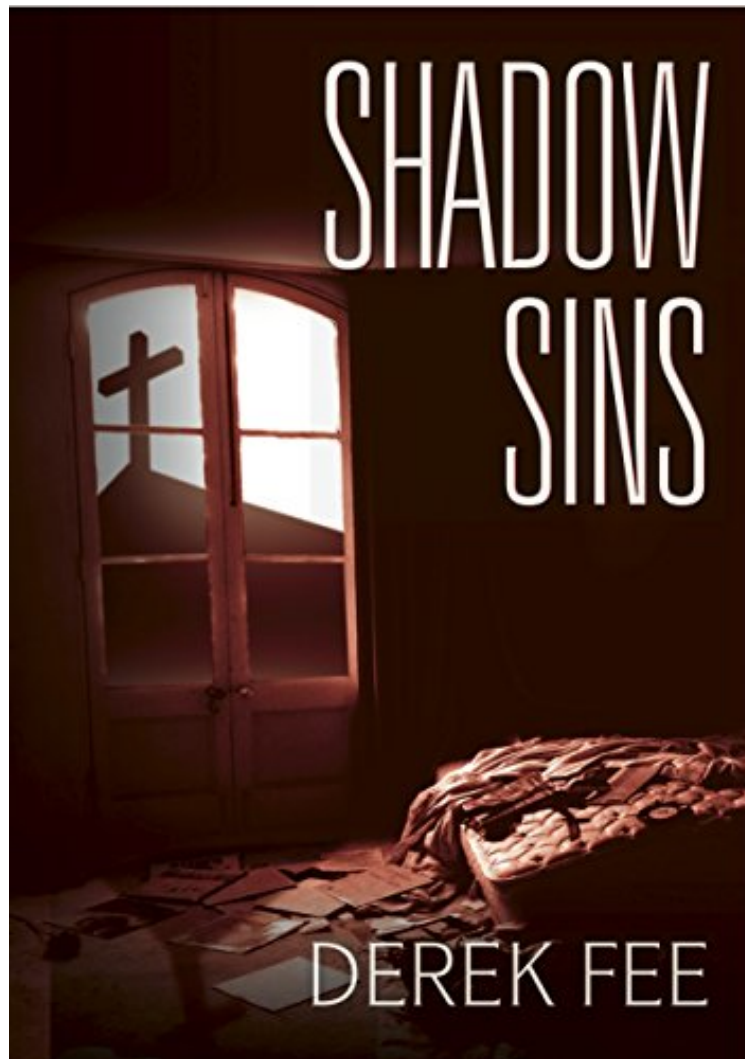

Colleagues will be employed to spy his every move, and a badly finished arrest gives the awfully depicted DCC Jennings, a member of the masonic Orange Lodge like almost all higher echelons in the force, in politics and - the Roman Catholic Church, the right motive. He unleashes the Internal Affairs, to have Wilson removed, to replace him with one of his pet officers - awfully depicted that one, too. Jennings and Hamilton - in one scene compared to Stan Ollie - cost this very good written and interesting police procedural the fifth star. They are simply too much for my gusto. The murderous stabbing and immolation of a catholic priest in his church is from the beginning seriously disturbed by the Catholic Church. The Bishop of Belfast himself - who dreams of a life in Rome beneath the Pope - is acting very strange behind the scenes. There is strong opposition to the correct collecting of material that could cast some light on the motive or better still, the culprit(s). The priest is immaculate - basta! But soon a very dark cloud is appearing, as the priest is an animal of the worst kind! DCI Wilson with the help of his team has to work against the time when a second victim is found. A serial killer of priests in Belfast or Northern Ireland? Where the burning of churches has been a common sport for both sides - the Catholics as well as the Protestant? Will the fragile peace hold this time, too? This second police crime novel has less political grounds than the first book about DCI Wilson and his team. Less violent than Nothing but Memories (DCI Wilson Book 1) (English Edition) it is, too. This time we learn about the clerical problems looming over Belfast and Ulster. It also hasn't the lengths that slowed my reading of the first one very now and then a bit down. More centred, more fast-paced. Only the awfull descriptions of the DCC and his protege was disturbing the pleasure of a very good crime novel. A really recommendable read for those who look for relatively new "crime scenes". Next time - I am sure of that - the very talented author delivers a full 5-star book!
